

## WHAT IS ECO CHURCH?

Churches have become more aware in recent years of our responsibility as stewards of God's creation to care for the beautiful planet that the Creator has given us and we are challenged to know how to respond. This is where Eco Church comes in!

### SCARECROW BUILDING WORKSHOP

Learn the basics of making a scarecrow and use your creativity to personalise it on any of the four weeks above. This activity is organised by the Florence Nightingale Hospice. There will be a small charge for materials.

### **MISSION PRAYERS FOR JULY**

As we tend our own gardens this summer, it's good to remember that in some countries growing food is vital to survival.

Operation Agri, a development charity, helps some of the world's most disadvantaged people improve their lives. A variety of overseas projects is supported - agriculture, water, women's empowerment, skills training, and basic health clinics. The love of Jesus is shown in action, supporting needy communities to attack the basic causes of poverty, regardless of their religious, ethnic and cultural backgrounds.

### This year's focus is **Trees** Bees and Seeds.

Operation Agri supports the *Imarika* project in Tanzania with partner Emmanuel International (a charity we also support). Imarika helps village churches to bring their money, and restore their environment. They learn to grow and plant trees, nurturing the seedlings so that fruit can be harvested



for extra nutrition, and to improve the soil, without using expensive fertilisers, for better crops. They can also learn bee-keeping and other ways to earn money and lift families out of poverty.

## **Prayer:**

We give thanks, generous God, for the miracle of growth at this time of year.

We pray for Operation Agri workers in Tanzania and the people with whom they work. Give them wisdom as work the land, as they cooperate and learn from community together to save each other. May many more people have the joy of a good harvest and food security for their families. Amen.
